

Position: Youth and Children's Work Director

Location: The Well Community Church

Hours: 24 hours per week

Contract: 1 year renewable contract

Salary: £23-25,000 pro rata depending on experience

PURPOSE OF POST

- To lead the youth and children's teams of the Well Community Church, establishing and developing a culture of care, discipleship and mission among children and youth in line with the vision and values of the church.
- To be responsible for the development and delivery of the children's and youth programme for the 0 18 year olds within the Well Community Church.
- To establish links with the children and youth, their families and their friends.

CORE TASKS

Oversight Role

- Co-ordinate the children's and youth teams including: recruiting, training and maintaining the volunteer team; envisioning, equipping and motivating them to deliver the youth and children's programs.
- 2. Oversee Sunday and mid-week groups, ensuring they are well led and that they adhere to our values.
- 3. Supervise children's/youth work interns.
- 4. Develop prayer strategy and encourage prayer for the children's/youth work.

Direct Activity

- 5. Encourage the children and youth to be actively involved in the life of the church (in services and in missional communities) where possible. Facilitate opportunities for them to serve, lead and be discipled.
- 6. Initiate and lead children's and youth clubs/parties and any residential trips, (these will not exceed 5 days).
- 7. Initiate and manage any work needed in supporting children/youth in missional communities.
- 8. Any other reasonable tasks as requested by your line manager and the leadership team.

Proactive Networking

- 9. Network with local churches and children's/youth organisations, and Pioneer national & London churches as agreed with your line manager.
- 10. Establish and develop links with local schools.

Admin

11. Develop and manage the children's and youth budgets in conjunction with the finance officer.

- 12. Maintain and develop the children and youth data base and web pages and ensure good communications with the youth, the children, and their families.
- 13. Manage and maintain the necessary level of equipment/resources needed to deliver the children's/youth work programme.

Learning, development and support

- 14. Attend at least one external youth or children's work training event per year (paid for and included in work hours) and the Pioneer leader's conference.
- 15. Be part of an ongoing leaders 'huddle' (a challenge and support small group for missional leaders).

PERSONAL SPECIFICATION

- Is a committed Christian.
- Has proven experience leading a work with children, youth and families both within the church and in the wider community
- Has experience of successfully recruiting, inspiring and developing teams.
- Has the ability to work as a part of a number of different teams, and relate to people
 of all ages and different backgrounds.
- Desires to see children and youth discipled and living missionally.
- Has excellent communication, interpersonal and relational skills.
